Publication Ethics

These ethical rules are generally accepted by international scientific community. Editors, authors and reviewers of Magazine of Civil Engineering follow it in full. If an author or a reviewer breaks the rules stated below, the editorial office will follow the recommendations of Committee on Publication Ethics (<http://publicationethics.org/resources>).

1. Originality of articles. Magazine of Civil Engineering welcomes submissions for consideration which are original and not under consideration for any other publication at the same time. Self-plagiarism should be avoided. Verbatim copying of more than 10 per cent of previously published work is not recommended. Re-use of elements of other author's work is allowed with reference.

2. Plagiarism. We understand by plagiarism both verbatim copying and paraphrasing of another person's work or part of it.

Verbatim copying or paraphrasing of more than 10 per cent of another person's work should be avoided. Every use of significant part of another person's text should have references. When copying part of another person's work verbatim, quotation marks should be always used. Illustrations and tables taken from another person's work should also have a reference.

Plagiarism may be detected both by editors using special software and by reviewers. Each alleged case of plagiarism is thoroughly checked. Papers with confirmed plagiarism are rejected.

3. Peer-reviewing. All papers (all texts except under the headings "EVENTS" and "STANDARDS" and advertisements) are peer-reviewed by editorial board or by outside reviewers. Magazine of Civil Engineering uses double blind review (both the reviewer and the author remain anonymous). All discussions are held through the electronic edition system or through the mediation of the editor. In case of conflict another reviewer can be assigned.

4. Data validation. The authors take all responsibility for data correctness. In case of any data falsification or manipulation the paper will be rejected.

5. Authorship. Every person included in the author list should make a significant contribution to the research and take part in the article writing or critical discussion. The others should be mentioned to the acknowledgements. Ghost and guest authorship are not allowed.

The final version should be confirmed by all co-authors (within responsibility of corresponding author). Each author should be prepared to be responsible for the whole paper.

6. Conflict of interests. Every member of publishing process should try to avoid the conflict of interests. If the author knows about any conflict of interests regarding his or her paper (e.g. with potential reviewer), he or she should clearly state this fact in the covering letter. The reviewer who has a conflict of interests should also declare it and refuse to review the paper. The editor's responsibility is to check thoroughly all the potential cases of conflict of interests.
